



Welcome to kindergarten – We look forward to you becoming part of our group. Our task is to make you happy to be here, and we want to help you with that. We hope that you make a lot of friends so that you become part of our community – We know that as part of a safe community, you will have the best conditions to develop so that you are completely ready for your first day of school. Therefore, we also have a framework that will help communities work for everyone and from day one – It is the prerequisite for joining us that these frameworks are complied with and that both you and your parents help to comply with these.

First week in kindergarten

- We expect you to have at least the first week off and that you parents are flexible so that we can reach you.
It is our goal to make the start for your child as safe as possible for them, and we create communities that can be followed up throughout their upbringing.

Birthday

- In everyday life, sugar will not be served, but we would like it to be possible on special occasions. Therefore, you are allowed to include a single item that contains sugar on your birthday, just as we can also serve a goodie bag with chocolate or the like at Christmas or other holidays – We want to create a strong community among the children and being able to share something with your peers supports this purpose, and it must therefore be an option with us.

Toys and things brought

- We do not want children to bring their own toys. The kindergarten has enough. It is not community-forming and our experience is that it creates more conflicts than it creates relationships.

Clothes in the wardrobe

- In the wardrobe should be 2 of each outfit.
There should also be clothing and footwear for the weather and for the time of year. We are out every day.

Drop off & pick up

- In connection with the handover, we would like if you can try to keep it short. Kisses and hugs in the hallway before entering. It causes anxiety for the other children in the room if you spend too long in the room.



Toilet

- We want you to practice toilet visits at home. We do not have the opportunity to go with your child every time they go to the toilet.
Those with diaper babies are welcome to practice telling them when they have done shit, so we can help the baby faster.

Wash hands of

- Remember to wash your hands before going to the living room, or in the common room.

We help each other

- In our kindergarten, we help each other. Therefore, remember to clean up when you are picked up so that the adults can spend time with the other children.

Calls

- In kindergarten you will be offered 3 interviews: a pre-interview, my first time in kindergarten and a school conversation.

Self-reliance

- We are very concerned that the children are self-reliant. You are also welcome to train this at home, so that your children can have the success experiences that are by being able to do it themselves.

Lounge

- At aula you must register times on when you drop off and pick up. This gives us an overview so that we can better distribute our staff.
Remember to register who is downloading. We are not allowed to hand over your child to anyone other than your parents, unless you have written, for example, grandmother, grandfather, aunt, etc.
